**PART I: ACCESS TO INFORMATION FROM WRITTEN TEXTS (60 points)**

**BOOKSTORES UNDER THREAT**

These are not easy times for bookstores. Competition from Internet shopping sites has already forced many of them to fire employees or even close down completely. Now they are faced with yet another threat: the rapid increase in the popularity of e-books – electronic versions of books, which are bought on the Internet and read on a screen.

- 5 Our reporter spoke to Henry Mariner, owner of Mariner's Books in Sommerville, to see how bookstores are coping.

**Within the next five years, e-books are expected to account for over 50% of all book sales. Does this surprise you?**

- 10 Not at all. Unfortunately for us it's understandable, given the convenience of having a book transferred instantly onto your screen, and the fact that you can take your whole library with you wherever you go. And there's also the matter of price. E-books do not require printing, storage, or delivery, all of which cost a great deal of money. Consequently, a publisher can offer the electronic version of a book at a considerably lower price than bookstores can sell the printed version of the same book. All this is
- 15 forcing us to find new strategies that will help us stay in business.

**Such as?**

- Some stores have started specializing in used books, which are obviously cheaper. Others are trying to attract specific audiences, such as young children, for whom the traditional book still has a strong appeal. To be honest, I'm not sure measures like
- 20 these will be enough. There are, however, a few stores that have done something I believe has a much better chance of success, and which I'd also love to do at Mariner's if we could afford it: they've installed a fantastic invention – the Espresso Book Machine. The EBM prints and binds a high-quality copy of a book right there in the store, in just a few short minutes. There's a catalogue of millions of books to choose
- 25 from, including rare manuscripts and books that publishers are no longer printing. This greatly expands the selection a store can offer its customers.

**So would you say there's a future for bookstores?**

I sincerely hope so. After all, their disappearance would be a great loss – not only for customers who want to be able to leaf through a book before buying it, but also  
30 for publishers, who rely on our window displays to bring their books to the public's attention. These are things which have no real equivalent on the Internet. However, we're in the midst of a revolution here, and nobody knows where it will lead. So whether bookstores will still be around five years from now is anybody's guess.
